East Bridge Renovation

It's gone all a bit quiet on the East Bridge renovation conversation of late but not to disappoint, Shaan Ali, Senior Infrastructure Engineer, Surrey Highways has shared an update with us so we can in turn share it with you. The dates are not confirmed and are subject to Environment Agency consent. However the provisional start date for renovations is February 4th 2019.

This will include the installation of the temporary footbridge and scaffold access to the main structure.

It is proposed to have this all installed by mid-March. Once the start date is confirmed, advanced warning signs will be put up. The road will not be closed for the erection of the temporary footbridge but the road will be closed for traffic at the end of February 2019, beginning of March 2019. The proposed time scale for the bridge works and road closure will be from end of February/beginning of March until the end of October 2019 (approximately 8 months). Discussions are ongoing with the contractor to try and improve on this time line.

The work will be carried out by the term maintenance contractor, Kier, and subcontracted to R&W (Civil Engineering Division) https://www.rwcivilengineering.co.uk and Putney

& Wood Stone specialist https://www.putneyandwood.co.uk. During the works, the riverside carpark will be required for storage use from 4th February 2019 till the end of the whole scheme so will be partially closed off. The storage may be in the form of stacked cabins to minimise the footprint.

Parking spaces around the Green will be severely depleted with the closure of the riverside car park. Tilford Parish Council asks all residents to be considerate to other motorists and the environment when parking around the Green, especially during school runs. Parking on the Green is prohibited, even two wheels.

However, parking on the other side of the bridge will be much easier. So, come and use the village shop and park at your leisure!

Heather Humphrey's Bench

Canon Heather Humphrey's love of gardening has been fondly remembered with the dedication of a beautiful wooden bench given by the garden centre she frequently used to visit. David Wheelhouse, former owner of Frensham Garden Centre (now Squires), presented the RHS Chelsea acacia-wood bench to All Saints Church, Tilford, in memory of Heather, its parish priest.

The Revd John Morris, Vicar of the The Bourne and Tilford, dedicated the bench following a United Service at All Saints on All Saints Day Sunday (4 November), bringing together the congregations of all the churches in the United Benefice of The Bourne and Tilford. He expressed warm appreciation of the generous gift from Frensham Garden Centre which Heather had visited so many times. Blessing the memorial bench, he said: "We give thanks for Heather as we remember her smile, her love, her joy and her faith".

Following the dedication Heather's son and daughter-in-law, Stuart and Nigora Humphrey, who were married at All Saints in June, each laid bunches of flowers on the seat in his mother's memory.

The handsome bench, bearing a memorial plaque, stands at the top of the churchyard over-looking the church where Heather served as priest from 2014 until her death in February this year, aged 71. Beloved by the whole community, including the personnel of the Frensham Garden Centre, Heather continues to be greatly mourned and sadly missed.

The plaque on the bench reads:

All Saints School Grand Opening

A very special guest visited All Saints School this December when the Foreign Secretary, Jeremy Hunt, met his match taking on a Question Timestyle panel of children to officially open the school's new outdoor classroom

The children put their visitor through his paces asking him lots of questions about his work whilst asking him to answer some tough questions of their own.

All Saints were celebrating the opening of their brand new outdoor learning space which was funded by the fundraising events and contributions from the parents. The lovely new structure reflects the schools belief in outdoor learning. All Saints believes it is vital schools embrace the power of imaginative education outside the classroom walls.

Headteacher Sara Bedford said: "Children love being outside and there is substantial evidence that playing and working outdoors has fantastic benefits for the health, wellbeing and learning of children and their teachers.

"Outdoor learning is engaging, collaborative and highly creative. At All Saints, we plan carefully to ensure all our children are immersed in creative challenges every day. The opening of our new, all-weather outdoor classroom enables us to do this in beautiful natural surroundings. It's exciting and a real affirmation of our commitment to developing happy, well-balanced children. We were delighted to have the opportunity to showcase our vision and school with Mr Hunt. Our children thoroughly enjoyed meeting

and interviewing a government leader."

After Mr Hunt cut the ribbon to open the new classroom, the Tory MP for South West Surrey said: "All Saints School is a great place with staff doing a first-class job of teaching and developing young pupils.



"The creation of this outside classroom will enable the teachers to do even more to inspire and nurture these children – what a fantastic start to school life."

All Saints' development head and teacher Louise Walters, added the new outdoor classroom offered children a 'huge variety of opportunities' – from blasting rockets across the field to painting bluebells in the woods, challenging pupils to run for seven minutes before they're seven years old, to identifying British trees and birds.

"Our children's time outdoors makes for impressive results, cheerful children and all-round achievers at All Saints," she said. "Outdoor learning harnesses children's natural curiosity. It keeps them enthused – excited to learn, keen to solve problems, thinking critically, communicating with each other, building relationships and mastering persistence.

All are the building blocks for success in education and, as the World Economic Fund has stated, all will be essential skills for careers in the future."

Broadband Improvements beckon

The long promised 'gainshare' (reinvestment of the rebate that Surrey County Council had from BT after a higher than expected take up of the first rollout of 'VDSL' services) improvements to the existing infrastructure in the village appear to be coming closer to completion.



We now have confirmation that everyone who is connected to the Runfold exchange (that's everyone on Tilford Street from around Woodhill up) should be able to order a 'Fibre To The Home' product from your existing supplier in the next few weeks. BT have now installed fibres to the tops of the poles, and soon the connection between that fibre and your home will be possible.

That will offer householders a 330mbps connection by changing products but without changing supplier.

The other half of the village (everyone on Tilford Road and across the bridge slightly up Tilford Street) should be seeing improvements to their existing service soon when the new green cabinet that's been installed near Hythe Cottage is brought online. By bringing the connection point closer to the village those already on a 'VDSL' service will see an improved speed. We are also assured that those in the centre of the village who are still stuck on 'ADSL' services should be able to order an improved 'VDSL' service soon.

Unfortunately, all of these improvements have slightly derailed us looking at installing a 'Fibre To The Home' ('FTTH') solution for the village as a whole from a 3rd party internet company. Because half of the village will soon have 'FTTH' available, installing fibres to every house in the village is no longer commercially viable without us incurring a cost. So we now need to wait and see what position we are all in next year before looking at alternative solutions.

Thank you for your patience so far, and sorry it's going to take a little longer to find a solution for everyone. But we will get there.

Armistice Celebration Dinner



November's Barley Mow Wine Club coincided with the Armistice celebrations so it was decided to host a semi-regimented Black Tie Dinner to commemorate 100 years since Armistice with a theme of wines and foods that might have been served at a mess dinner 100 years ago.

At the December Parish Council meeting, the Chairman, Nigel Relf, tendered his resignation. Nigel has been in the role for around five years, being elected Chairman in September 2014 having been elected to the Council in 2011. Over the recent past he has found it more and more difficult to combine his Chairmanship with his considerable outside business interests. He leaves with the best wishes of his fellow Councillors and thanks for all the leadership and input he has made to the Council, in particular regarding planning applications. During his term in office, the Council have had several significant successes including being influential in the reinstatement of Post Office facilities in the Village Shop, replacing the old playground, campaigning for faster broadband, working with Surrey Count Council to reduce speeding and other traffic calming measures.

At an extraordinary Council Meeting on December 19th, Councillor Debra Lee was nominated for, and accepted, the Chairmanship. Debra was coopted onto the Council in May, 2016, and has been enthusiastically involved in several aspects of village life including: setting up Speed Watch, driving the installation of a new playground, co-editor of Tilford Life and the project addressing parking around the Village Green. In addition, Mickey Benson was coopted onto the Council.

Garden Hints for January and February.

- Recycle your Christmas tree by shredding for mulch.
- Plant trees, shrubs, roses, and hedges as long as the ground isn't frozen or waterlogged.
- On mild days prune back fruit trees, hedges, and wisteria.
- Ventilate greenhouses when possible and check regularly for wind-damaged panes.
- Dig over vacant ground and work in well rotted manure or compost, leaving it roughly dug so that the frost will break up the soil for you.
- Inspect stored fruit, vegetables and dahlia tubers, removing any rotting items.
- After snowdrops have flowered, divide up clumps and replant while plants are still green.
- Keep putting out food and water for hungry birds.
- Stay by the fire, look through the catalogues and get your seed order in!

Did you know!



The bright red iconic telephone kiosk opposite the village shop is a Grade 11 listed structure. In December 1987 it was listed under the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 for its special or historic interest. The majority of sites are buildings, but the kiosk joins other structures such as bridges, monuments, sculptures, war memorials, and even milestones and mileposts and The Beatles' Abbey Road pedestrian crossing!

It is a cast iron, square kiosk, Type K5, designed by Sir Giles Gilbert Scott in 1935 with a domed roof, George V1 crowns in the top panels and marginal glazing to windows and door.

About six years ago, a notice appeared inside from British Telecom saying that the telephone service had been disconnected and the kiosk could be purchased for £1 and

the service could be reconnected at the purchaser's expense. The Parish Council decided not to purchase the kiosk so British Telecom still remains the owner.

A listed structure may not be demolished, extended, or altered without special permission from the local planning authority. Owners must repair and maintain them and can face criminal prosecution if they fail to do so or if they perform unauthorised alterations. As a result, British Telecom maintain the kiosk and periodically clean and paint it.
