The Islamabad community's new mosque officially opens

A special reception was held on 29th June 2019 to mark the opening of the new mosque of the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community, Islamabad, Tilford.

The Ahmadiyya community has lived in Tilford since 1984. The community occupies the site, which had previously been Sheephatch School, which closed in 1977 and remained unused until the Community purchased the 33-acre site and renamed the property as Islamabad. The recently developed site has 33 refurbished homes and houses, an equestrian centre, a sports hall and administrative buildings.

The sports hall features a unique green roof with its own ecological system ensuring foliage all year round. All the properties have been built with solar panels.

The event was a celebration and a chance to welcome the community to visit, following the redevelopment and the official opening of their new mosque. Visitors enjoyed a tour of the site followed by a seated reception dinner where the keynote address was delivered by the Leader of the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community, His Holiness Hazrat Mirza Masroor Ahmad. The speech was delivered in the presence of 300 guests, including local residents and neighbours, community leaders and politicians, amongst them Rt Hon Dominic Grieve QC MP, former Attorney General and Sir Ed Davey MP

The Leader of the Ahmadiyya community, who are widely known for their voluntary and aid work, thanked the local residents and councillors for their support of the development and has pledged to work together, running community events and building a harmonious relationship.

Welcome to the September Young Tilford! Are you all back and school? Yes...I thought so! Well even though the summer is over and autumn is on it's way, don't worry...this edition of Young Tilford is here to keep you busy now you are back from your holidays!

This edition is all about trees! Did you know that Tilford has an amazing oak tree at each of the 3 corners of the Green and they all have a story? Have a read through the fact file below and go and find the Oaks for yourself!! 😊

Fact File:



The first one (on the corner closest to the Barley Mow Pub) was planted to commemorate 60 years of Queen Victoria's time as queen. It's got a special plaque and was planted in 1897. Here is a picture of Queen Victoria and how she looked then!



Start a tree journal

Record how your tree changes through the year

Have any animals made your tree their home?

Pigeons making a nest

look out for insects

Spiders

Ants

Caterpillars

Beetles

Keep notes on the animals that visit your tree.

Lots of squirrels collecting acorns today

Does your tree make seeds? If so measure them. How long are they? What do they weigh?

What happens when you drop one of its seeds? Does it roll, break, flutter, glide or bounce?

Can you see signs that it's growing?

Does your tree lose its leaves?

Trees that lose their leaves at the end of summer are called 'deciduous'. Trees that keep them all year round are 'evergreen'.

Leaf rubbings

Collect any leaves that fall to make a leaf rubbing picture.

Place the leaf under a piece of paper.

Rub a wax crayon over the paper until a picture of the leaf appears.

The top one, closest to the church, was originally planted for King George V in 1910. However, in 1987 there was a massive storm and the Oak was uprooted. So the village decided to plant another one, using an acorn from the original tree! Here is the picture of it a sapling. Some of you might recognise the people in the picture! Go and have a look at the Oak now...it's nothing like the little plant it was then!



On The third corner of the Green is another Oak that was planted in 1902 (That's ages away) It's a beautiful tree planted for the coronation (when he became king) of King Edward VII in 1902.
